Dr. Ybarra is Associate Professor and Director of Graduate Studies in the Department of English at the University of North Texas. Her book *Writing the Goodlife: Mexican American Literature and the Environment* (2016) was chosen for the 2017 Thomas J. Lyon Award in Western American Literary and Cultural Studies and was selected as one of the six finalists for the 2017 ASLE Ecocriticism Book Award. She is co-editor of the forthcoming *Latinx Environmentalisms: Place, Justice, and the Decolonial* (Fall 2019). She serves on the board of directors for the Rio Puerco Rangeland Trust in New Mexico, on the Executive Council of the Association for the Study of Literature and Environment (ASLE), and she served a three-year term on the Board of Directors for Orion Magazine.
